

Bayfield St Shoreline Rehabilitation

The Municipality of Meaford is undertaking a construction project along Bayfield St to rehabilitate the shoreline. The shoreline serves as a protective barrier for vital infrastructure, including roads, sidewalks, storm sewers, water and wastewater lines and with high water levels in recent years, has become compromised. The completion of repairs in this area will not only secure these essential spaces but also extend to enhancing the safety of the green space atop the shoreline.

We would like to share the following information regarding the project and how it may impact you:

Project Details

Location:	Bayfield Street at Fred Raper Park
Schedule:	Anticipated Start: September 1, 2023 Estimated Completion: September 30, 2023
Scope:	Rehabilitation of the shoreline and green space, which includes drainage improvements and placement of boulders to reduce erosion concerns and loss of shoreline from wave action.
Contractor:	Naturally Green Landscaping

How Will the Project Impact You?

Pre-Condition:	The Contractor will be preparing the area immediately around the site for demolition activities and erecting a construction fence along the perimeter of the work. A few parking spaces may be occupied by construction equipment during the work.
Parking Lot Access During Construction:	The Fred Raper Park parking lot will be inaccessible from the usual entrances on Bayfield Street. The sidewalk along Fred Raper Park, along with a few parking spaces at the east end of the parking lot will be temporarily inaccessible. We ask that you do not park near the construction areas during the construction hours (8 AM to 7 PM on Monday through Thursday and 8 AM to 1 PM on Fridays. No weekend work will take place).



	The Contractor will attempt to tidy the area as work progresses, but final restoration will occur near the end of the project.
Noise:	Residents, property owners and businesses should expect some noise during construction times.
Dust:	Residents, property owners and businesses should expect dusty conditions during some construction activities. Efforts will be made to reduce dust as much as possible.
Vibration:	The possibility of vibrations due to compaction equipment during construction is not anticipated to be significant but residents should protect valuables that may be susceptible to damage as a result of vibration.
